Programmes And Activities Implemented At The CTMSC

- Mentors:

“Demonstrate the bond you have with a child or a friend through an act of love and feel the bond of loving kindness.”

Children of the Welfare Organisations are vulnerable, most of the times uncertain and sometimes alone. Through the mentorship-programme we try to bridge this problem.

A young, working adult is allocated to each individual child in grade 7 to grade 12. The motivation behind this allocation is for the mentor and child to travel together on the journey we call life. The mentor assist, guide and motivate the child when decisions have to be made and when there are difficulties to overcome.

Their journey does not end when the child leaves the school, this is only the beginning – it is an ongoing process. The guidance and assistance goes on to ensure the child follows his/her dreams, makes the best of every second and lives a pleasant and meaningful life.

- Junior Mentors:

“When children are frustrated or get involved in put-down behaviour, RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS works beautifully.”

Here we try to create a space for comfort, assurance and relaxation in order for the children to adapt easier on a social level – whether in a group or individually. It is a programme where the children in grades lower than grade 7 are involved with group-discussion and -activities or on a one-to-one basis with mentors.

It is all in the name: “Let us Learn”. An extra-mural programme where volunteers help the children with homework, projects, tasks and computer-skills. To ensure the children adapt easier on a scholastic and academic level.

- Koinonia:

Koinonia is the generally-known term for “fellowship”. This is the permanent, continuous togetherness of God’s children. Although it is our primary focus to reach out to the underprivileged, it is important to reach out to each other as well.

We maintain a policy of openness with all volunteers, welfare organisations or any individual who wants to establish a close relationship or learn from us on a social or strategic basis. Our social events are open to any organisation or individual.
